A2 THE ENROLLMENT CARD (SCRIPTS)

"I've drafted something for us — one page. It's a VO, and I want your pen on it."

REASON (one sentence, data, owning your side): "I counted _____. We _____ — and I'm half the problem."

TRADE (your cost first): "I'm giving up _____. I'm asking for _____."

THE PEN: "What's wrong with this draft?" — then silence. Fight for standards; concede baselines, days, names.

ROUTES — SKEPTIC: "Fair. Two weeks, two standards, numbers at the table — if it's theater we burn it together." PASSENGER: "I don't want your sign-off. I want _____ to be yours — design it, host it, call its breaches."

OPPONENT: hold your conduct warmly through three test-cycles → relocate the standard, never the person → re-offer in 30 days.

THE TEST (within 72h): routing held warm and verbatim; every quote paid.

A3 THE COMMONS FORTRESS CHECKLISTS

HOUSEHOLD

- ☐ Phone Parking Dock installed, windows written, adults dock first
- ☐ Notification Treaty — three lanes, double-call rule
- ☐ Interruption Pricing — signals agreed, quotes paid
- ☐ Kitchen Sterilization — four passes as a crew, prep session named
- ☐ Recovery Perimeter — zero chargers in bedrooms
- ☐ Logistics Slot — one fixed 15-min window replaces ambient negotiation

TEAM

- ☐ Meeting Rules Treaty — no agenda no meeting, 20-min default, build-mornings protected, recurring meetings carry expiry dates
- ☐ Notification Treaty — URGENT/LOGISTICS/SOCIAL lanes, URGENT audited weekly
- ☐ Interruption Pricing — focus signals honored, deferrals paid
- ☐ After-Hours Expectation — written, URGENT lane only

RE-MEASURE within 7 days: old ratio 1:_____ → new ratio 1:_____

A4 **THE TABLE REVIEW AGENDA CARD** *(READ ALOUD AT MINUTE ZERO)*

0-5 NUMBERS FIRST — ledgers speak before anyone does; domain owners report their own standards.

5-10 BREACHES BY LAYER — “which layer failed?”, never “why did you”; owners name their own where possible.

10-15 ONE PATCH — exactly one; written, dated, initialed on the Charter.

15-20 APPLAUSE ON PURPOSE — each member names one standard they watched someone else hold. End here. Always.

STANDING RULES: no new grievances after minute ten · no relitigating patches mid-week · the review runs in bad weeks especially (15-min MV version standing in the kitchen counts).

A5 THE FIRST-THIRTY TEMPLATE (ONBOARDING AS INHERITANCE)

DAY 1: the newcomer watches a live Table Review. No values deck.

WEEK 1: they receive the Charter with the pen offered — “mark what’s unclear; you’re the freshest eyes we’ll get.”

WEEK 2: they own one small standard whole — domain, baseline, MV, repair.

DAY 30: they present their own numbers at the review. Enrollment complete, at the moment it was cheapest.

HOUSEHOLD VARIANT: the guest, grandparent, or sitter is briefed by a member who is not you.

A6 THE HANDOVER SCHEDULE (PER CHILD)

STANDARD → moved rightward one column per quarter, at a review, out loud, whole (behavior · baseline · MV · repair · redesign rights).

I HOLD FOR THEM: _____ THEY HOLD WITH ME: _____ THEY OWN: _____

RULE: a wobble inside an owned standard is tuition; a parental seizure is a refund. Shrink doses at their request only.

ENDPOINT (written on day one): by departure, every column has migrated. The child holds the pen.

A7 THE GROUP TROUBLESHOOTING MATRIX

Nº1	IF <i>The Commons Extraction never opens</i>	THEN Log tonight's shared block only; one block breaks the seal.
Nº2	IF <i>An ownership statement demands a name</i>	THEN Re-scope the person into a structure and rewrite it.
Nº3	IF <i>A removed drift-cue reappears</i>	THEN It has an owner; it goes on the Charter agenda, not into a silent relocation war.
Nº4	IF <i>The staged best-behavior item goes untouched for a week</i>	THEN Stage what the group already loves but never starts.
Nº5	IF <i>The Tolerance Ledger tempts a mid-week eruption</i>	THEN Close it for the day and re-read the Consent Line; ammunition is not measurement.
Nº6	IF <i>Your own breach column dwarfs the group's</i>	THEN Celebrate the finding and start there; the leak reports to you.
Nº7	IF <i>True notices land awkwardly</i>	THEN Cut them to one sentence and keep going; awkwardness is a new currency circulating.
Nº8	IF <i>The REWARDED column won't move in a month</i>	THEN The dominant gaze isn't yours; its holder tops the Enrollment list.
Nº9	IF <i>A deferred interruption returns angry</i>	THEN Audit the payment record; one unpaid quote costs ten honored ones.
Nº10	IF <i>The Charter's requirement won't decompose</i>	THEN It is a wish about closeness; convert it to countable shared behavior.
Nº11	IF <i>A standard keeps failing wet Tuesdays</i>	THEN Shrink its baseline at the review — never the standard, never unilaterally.
Nº12	IF <i>The Enrollment collapsed into the past</i>	THEN You opened with the verdict; wait three days, return with the page, not the history.
Nº13	IF <i>You detect a Passenger</i>	THEN Assign a whole domain before sundown; audiences drift home when you tire.

Nº14	IF <i>The Opponent's no still stands after three held cycles</i>	THEN Relocate the standard, keep the warmth, re-offer in 30 days.
Nº15	IF <i>A Fortress install keeps failing</i>	THEN It skipped enrollment; it goes to the review agenda, not into re-imposition.
Nº16	IF <i>The Repair Ritual came out as a speech</i>	THEN Cut to the three beats and rerun at the next breach; ceremony is the failure mode.
Nº17	IF <i>The review became a gripe session</i>	THEN The card wasn't read at minute zero; read it verbatim, however it feels.
Nº18	IF <i>A standard collapsed in the Absence Test</i>	THEN It was obeyed, never enrolled; return to Chapter 9 for its domain and check the trade.

A8 THE GROUP FIRST-FAILURE DECISION TREE

The structure failed today. Answer in order; stop at the first yes.

Q1	Did it fail because the terrain allowed it?	→ Ch 3 / Install list. Fix the commons tonight.
Q2	Did it fail because a breach passed unaddressed?	→ Ch 4. One calibration, within the hour, at conversational volume.
Q3	Did it fail because the wrong behavior got the attention?	→ Ch 5. Re-aim the applause this week.
Q4	Did it fail because interruption was free?	→ Ch 6/10. Re-post the price; audit the URGENT lane.
Q5	Did it fail on your worst day, in view of the group?	→ Ch 11. Hold the MV visibly; run the Repair Ritual.
Q6	Did the group never actually enroll?	→ Ch 9. Check the trade. Re-offer the pen.
Q7	None of the above?	→ It waited for the review. File it, patch once, resume. That is the system working.
